

List of Authorised Witnesses for Certifying Photographs

If you are applying for a Working with Children (WWC) Check and do not have any photographic identification, the list of authorised witnesses below can certify a recent photograph which can be used as part of your 100 Point Proof of Identity Check.

How to Certify a Photograph

The authorising person (from the list below) must sight a recent photograph of the applicant and provide the following information:

- 1. stamp or write "This is a true image of (name of the applicant)";
- 2. print their name and position or role e.g. Justice of the Peace;
- signature; and
- 4. date of signature.
- Academic (post-secondary institution);

- Agent of the Australian Postal Corporation who is in charge of an office supplying postal services to the public;
- Architect;
- Australian Consular Officer or Australian Diplomatic Officer (within the meaning of the Consular Fees Act 1955);
- Bailiff:
- Bank officer with five or more years of continuous service;
- Building Society officer with five or more years of continuous service;
- CEO of a Commonwealth court;
- Chairperson, secretary or CEO of an incorporated indigenous organisation;
- Chartered secretary;
- Chemist;
- Chiropractor;
- Commissioner for Affidavits;
- Commissioner for Declarations:
- Company auditor or liquidator;
- Court officer;
- Credit Union officer with five or more years of continuous service;
- Judge of a court;
- Justice of the Peace;

- Dentist:
- Electorate Officer of a Member of State Parliament;
- Employee of the Australian Trade Commission who is:
 - a) in a country or place outside Australia; and
 - b) authorised under paragraph 3(d) of the Consular Fees Act 1955; and
 - c) exercising his or her function in that place;
- Employee of the Commonwealth who is:
 - a) in a country or place outside Australia; and
 - b) authorised under paragraph 3(d) of the Consular Fees Act 1955; and
 - c) exercising his or her function in that place;
- Engineer;
- Fellow of the National Tax Accountants' Association:
- Finance company officer with five or more years of continuous service;
- Holder of a statutory office not specified in another item in this list;
- Industrial organisation secretary;
- Insurance broker;

 - b) a non-commissioned officer within the meaning of the *Defence Force*Discipline Act 1982 with five or more years of continuous service; or
 - c) a warrant officer within the meaning of that Act;
- Member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia, the Australian Society of Certified Practising Accountants or the National Institute of Accountants;
- Member of:
 - a) the Parliament of the Commonwealth; or
 - b) the Parliament of a State; or
 - c) a Territory legislature; or
 - d) a local government authority of a State or Territory;
- Minister of religion registered under Subdivision A of Division 1 of Part IV of the Marriage Act 1961;
